The last video was posted just over two months after the last time he recited the Nigerian pledge, which he defined as a convoy - an Islamic concept of associating with God and considered one of the greatest sins in Islam. In the 26-minute video published in the Guardian, the noticeably aging Shakao reiterated his anti-government messages and aversion to Western influence. He cited Der Sanusi Iguada's Deffin Boko and Babs Paponwa's history in Nigeria to defend why Muslims should reject Western education because of its Jewish-Christian roots. Shaddau denied that his eyes were failing, and that only some of his fighters do not perform five mandatory daily prayers for Muslims. The Nigerian government and military have consistently claimed in the past two years that Boko Haram has been humiliated or defeated. The real Boko Haram we know is defeated, said Garba Shu, a spokesman for Nigerian President Muhammadu Buhari, in July. An AFP news agency report said the split occurred because Coe indiscriminately repelled the attacks on civilians. The larger and more sophisticated group is affiliated with Islamic State and is known as the Islamic State in the West African Province (ISWAP). The smaller, more coiled faction is led by Shekau and Nona Jamaat Ahl al-Sunna Li-I-Dawa Wah-ul-Jihad (JAS). Since July, dozens of strikes on military bases, most of which have been blamed on the ISWAP, have been claimed by ISIS as ISWAP attacks. The raids are part of wider patterns of attacks in northern Borno, which the country has warned is increasingly affecting civilians. ISWAP has recently stepped up its armed campaign, launching several major assaults on military targets in Borno and the neighboring state of Yuba, against signs of a takeover by tougher leaders. More than 27,000 people have been killed since the uprising began in 2009, 1.8 million people are still homeless and need humanitarian assistance. As the country continues to mourn at least 43 rice farmers beheaded by Boko Haram terrorists last Saturday in the Zabarmari area of Brno State, the leader of the sect's faction, Abubakar Shekau, appeared in a new video claiming responsibility for the attack. In the new video, released in 37 seconds, titled رارر (New Post), Boko Haram accused the farmers of arresting one of its members and handing it over to the Nigerian military. He also warned those who arrested or campaigned against Boko Haram terrorists to await a similar fate. [8] A biography in shekko's early years was born in Shekko, in the local government of Tremva, Yuba State; His exact date of birth is unknown, but it should be between 1965 and 1975. Shekau is an ethnic canoe, and also speaks Hausa, Fulani, Arabic and English. In 1990, he moved to the Pony area of Miduguri and studied with a traditional cleric before entering the College of Law and Islamic Studies in Borno (now called the College of Law and Islamic Studies Mohammad Goni). Shaddow left college for ideological reasons. He later met Muhammad Yusef, founder of Jama'at Ahlos Sunna Li Dawa and Al Jihad, and became one of his deputies. Shaku was appointed group leader in July 2009 after Yusuf's death in the 2009 Boko Haram uprising. Shaddau survived being shot in the leg during the attempt on his life by Nigerian security forces in 2009. [3] He is married to one Yusuf's four widows. His nickname is Darul Toheed, which translates as an expert on Tweed, the Islamic concept of Allah's unity. [11] Boko Haram's leadership leader, Shekko, did not go unchallenged. He received a letter from Al-Qaeda in the Islamic Maghreb giving him advice, but did not answer that. [Editing] external links as a result of his erratic leadership, in 2012 a faction of the group disbanded to form Jamaat Ansar al-Muslimin according to Bild a-Sudan (Ansaro). This faction included his military commander, Abu Mohammed al-Bukawi, and religious advisor Sheikh Abu Osama al-Ansari Muhammad Awal al-Gombawi. Despite this, many soldiers and commanders stayed with Shekau, including military commanders Abu Saad al-Bamawi and Mohammed Salfi. With his group largely intact, Sheka engaged in a confrontation with Ansaro and killed their leader Abu Osama al-Ansari. As a result, and further arrests of Ansaro's leaders by the Nigerian government, Ansaro posed no further threat to Shadao's leadership of the jihadist movement in Nigeria, and the group was cut off until 2015. Shaka's friends, jihadist fighters, were undisciplined and abused by populations they encountered, resulting in the formation of civilian militias like the Joint Civilian Task Force to fight them. Shekau is also considered his own religious advisors, including Sheikh Abdel-Malek al-Ansari al-Kadunawi and Abu al-Abbas al-Bankiwani. In June 2012, the U.S. State Department designated Shekau a terrorist and effectively froze his assets in the United States. Since June 2013, the department has won a standing award of \$7 million for information leading to Shaddow's capture through its Justice Rewards Program. In addition, the Nigerian military offered a ₦ \$US50 million (about \$US300,000) reward for Shakao. In videos Shaw posted online, he often boasted about his invincibility; mocking different armies; And declared that he could not be arrested and could not die but by Allah. He also boasted that he possessed armored tanks and other combat vehicles. His online videos often depict anti-American rhetoric, and he has threatened widely to attack the U.S. in one notable incident; he took credit for kidnapping more than 200 schoolgirls in April 2014. [19] Shao also announced that the kidnapped girls had been converted to Islam. He claimed to be w rrunning a jihad against Christianity. [21] With the rise of the Islamic State in Iraq and Syria in 2014 and 2015, Shekau faced pressure from his commanders and soldiers to pledge allegiance to ISIS leader Abu Bakr al-Baghdadi. The group said that Dao had to give allegiance, and that was through the rallying of the military commanders, and after became convinced that the matter was about to come out of his hand, and that his throne would rock and empty him if he did not loyalty. In In 2016, ISIL appointed Abu Musab al-Bernawi as the group's leader instead of Sheka. [22] Shaka refused to recognize Bernawi's authority and separated from part of the group under her original name Jamaat Ahlos Sona Li Dawa and Al Jihad, while Bernawi leads the West African province of the Islamic State. While Cao continues to lead his team, he has only 1,500 troops, while Brnaway has 3,500. [24] Shakau was widely condemned as a leader following the ideology of the Khawarij by the Islamic State and the West African province of Nigeria. The split was followed by numerous clashes between Shekou's soldiers and Bernawi's soldiers during August and the months that followed. On September 12, 2016, 30 of Shakao's soldiers were killed and 40 captured by IS-West Africa. In October 2016, Shaku's troops attacked the Karino area south of Lake Chad, with 350 people swooping on the village of Tonovoma. Barnaoui's soldiers then attacked more than 75, including leader Mohammed Bakr. [Edit] External links reports of death that Dao was reported dead in 2009, but reappeared as group leader less than a year later. The Nigerian military said in mid-August 2013 that it was critically wounded when soldiers raided a Boko Haram base in the Sambizza Forest and died between July 25 and August 3. [26] However, in September 2013, a video was posted in which a man claimed he was not killed. The Nigerian military also said it killed him during the Battle of Kodunga in 2014 and lasted from September 12 to 14. The Camorran army posted a picture[29] and even claimed that its forces killed Shakao in September 2014. [30] [31] In response to these reports, security analyst Ryan Cummings responded: Is this his fourth or fifth death? He died more often than an iPhone battery. In early October 2014, an AFP news agency video was obtained that showed Shaddow alive, mocking the Nigerian military's claims that he had been killed. [33] Chadian President Idriss Deby claimed in mid-August 2015 that Shako had been replaced by Mehmet Daoud without specifying his fate. [35] A voicemail attributed to Shekau was released a few days later, in which he allegedly stated that he had not been killed or voted out of office as head of the group. On August 19, 2016, shekko was reported critically wounded during an airstrike in the village of Tay on August 19, 2016 by the Nigerian Air Force, which also killed several senior Boko Haram leaders. [37] On September 25, a video of a man claiming to be Shekau was posted claiming to be alive and well. On June 27, 2017, Shekko released a video claiming responsibility for the abduction of Nigerian police officers and criticizing the Nigerian government for claiming Boko Haram had been defeated. [40] This video appears to be further evidence of Shakau's continued survival. In February 2020, Shadau released a threatening video Information and Digital Economy Minister Issa Ali Pantami referred to what was done to Islamic scholar Jafar Mahmoud Adam in Miduguri when he preached against Boko Haram.
